

DISPLAY COLORS

Q: Why doesn't my display look more colorful?

A: Informal observation suggests many users don't have their computer's monitor configured to show its true colors.

Fortunately, Windows 95/98/NT allows a user to do a lot of fine-tuning with the computer's display so that it looks its best.

Begin by clicking the start menu selecting the "settings" and opening "control panel." Now click on the "settings" icon to begin a series of choices.

Under "color palette," the lowest and least colorful choice is 256 colors. If your computer is no more than two years old, chances are it can do a lot better than 256 colors, also known as 8-bit color.

Choose the next level, 65,536 colors, also referred to as "high" color or 16-bit color or 32 (Highest) color, and check the results. The computer should blossom with a new range of color.

Note; Write down what the setting was before you made changes, so it can be changed back if necessary.
