- d) If you talk to neighbors is the service reliable?
- e) If something breaks how long does it take to get it fixed?
- f) How is their customer support? Helpful? Open 24 x 7?
- g) Do I need to install it myself? Can I do the install?

DSL is fine and so is cable. They both work well and if given a choice between one or the other, price and support would be my deciding factors. Sometimes the price can be negotiated if you are using price as your determining factor.
