**RSS FEEDS**

**What is RSS?**

RSS (Rich Site Summary) is a format for delivering regularly changing web content. Many news-related sites, weblogs and other online publishers syndicate their content as an RSS Feed to whoever wants it.

**Why RSS? Benefits and Reasons for using RSS**

RSS solves a problem for people who regularly use the web. It allows you to **easily stay informed** by retrieving the latest content from the sites you are interested in. You **save time** by not needing to visit each site individually. You **ensure your privacy**, by not needing to join each

site's email newsletter. The number of [sites offering RSS feeds](#) is growing rapidly and includes big names like [Yahoo News](#).

## **What do I need to do to read an RSS Feed? RSS Feed Readers and News Aggregators**

Feed Reader or News Aggregator software allow you to grab the RSS feeds from various sites and display them for you to read and use.

### **Viewing RSS Feeds**

**If you want info from your favorite websites quickly, use RSS Feeds.**

- 1. While at your favorite news site or any other changing website, click Favorites on Internet Explorer.**
- 2. Click Feeds.**
- 3. To display the feeds in a folder, click the folder and click a Feed.**
- 4. Click the green arrow icon to the right of the feed date and time to go to the full entry on the website.**
- 5. To add an RSS feed, click the RSS feed button in the IE8 menu.**
- 6. Click the Subscribe to this FEE link.**
- 7. Enter a new name for the feed as desired.**
- 8. Click Subscribe and a confirmation display appears.**

### **Disable Add-Ons**

**Internet Explorer includes add-ons. If you wish to disable these add-ons:**

- 1. Click Start...All Programs...Internet Explorer.**
- 2. Click Tools and select Manage Add-Ons.**
- 3. Select the type of add-on to manage.**
- 4. Select an add-on.**
- 5. Click Disable**
- 6. Click Disable on the Disable Add-On dialog box to confirm.**

### **Privacy Features in IE 8**

**To protect your privacy:**

- 1. Open IE 8 and click Tools**
- 2. Select Internet Options**
- 3. Click the privacy tab.**
- 4. Select MEDIUM or higher to restrict cookies (note some websites will not allow you access unless you allow cookies.**

**5. Near the bottom of that screen be sure that there is a check in Turn On Popup Blocker.**

**6. The Do Not Collect Data box should not be checked.**

**7. The Disable Toolbars should be checked.**

**8. If you have made changes above, click Apply and Ok.**

### **Delete History List in IE 8**

**1. Open IE8 and click Tools**

**2. Click Internet Options**

**3. Under Browsing History, click Delete. A box opens with 4 items checked. They are Preserve Favorites website data, Temporary Internet Files, Cookies and History.**

**4. Click Delete and OK.**

**If you prefer to delete some items on History list but leave others:**

**1. Open IE 8 and click the down arrow in the address bar to show History list.**

**2. Select the items you wish to remove and click the X by them.**

### **Printing Web Pages**

**IE allows you to print webpages as YOU want them printed using Print Preview, Page view or Shrink to fit. Open IE and with the website in front of you**

**1. Open the Print menu.**

**2. Select Print Preview**

**3. Click to move through the pages.**

**4. Select viewing options**

**5. Select print size options**

**6. Click Print**

### **Saving a Web Page**

**1. Open the web page.**

2. Click File or on the command toolbar choose Page.
3. Usually the folder in which to save it comes up as Documents, but you may choose a different folder if you prefer.
4. The website name will be already listed in the Name box but you may change the name, if you prefer
5. Click SAVE

**Note: To choose a different format (other than the default MHTML), click the down arrow in the Save as Type box and select a format listed.**
