## **AOL EMAIL has no Name, Date, etc**

Rarely this happens and there are several things that can cause it to happen. Just a reinstall of the AOL program may not fix your problem. Follow the steps as given, and be sure that you Save the PFC to a folder on your hard drive as it instructs you to do...don't skip steps.

#### **AOL Footer Ads**

Do you want to remove the annoying advertising footer AOL sticks at the bottom of e-mails? (You don't see them, but the person you send a message to does.) If you're a paid AOL user, log on to AOL WebMail, choose Settings (it's on the right side of the screen), then Compose, and click "Turn on/off message footer."

IF you're using the installed AOL Client program,

Click Keyword and type in Footer.

If there is a check in the box SHOW FOOTER IN EMAILS SENT....., Click to remove the check.

Click SAVE.

If you're a paying AOL user, you can get rid of those ads.

If you're using a MAC, go to keyword AOL Message Footer Settings. Uncheck the box "show the message footer....."

Another way to get rid of those ads and make more room for email:

"Click on the top blue bar (the Title bar) of the email and drag it down until the ad's are hidden. Then go back up to the Title bar again which is now about 1/3 of the way down the page, again click it and this time drag it back up to the top of the monitor screen."

#### **AOL Mail Control Blocks**

You can use the AOL Mail Controls to block e-mails from a specific e-mail address or domain.

Note: A domain is the part of the e-mail address after the @ symbol. For example, if the e-mail address is address@aol.com, aol.com® would be the domain.

Block an e-mail address or domain

When you do not want to receive e-mail from a specific e-mail address or domain, you can add them to your Mail Controls block list.

To block an e-mail address or domain:

- 1. Go to www.aol.com, then click the Mail icon.
- 2. In the Screen Name or E-mail: box, type your AOL® screen name.
- 3. In the Password: box, type your AOL® password.
- 4. Click the Sign In button.
- 5. In the upper right, click the Settings link.
- 6. Click the Spam Controls tab.
- 7. In the Spam Filters by Address section, click the drop-down menu, then choose Custom from the list.
- 8. Choose the Block mail from option by clicking it.
- 9. In the Enter Screen Name or Email Address box, type the e-mail addresses which you wish to block.
- 10. Click the + button to insert the e-mail addresses in the box provided.
- 11. Click the Save button to save the changes.

## **ADDRESS Missing from Taskbar Toolbar**

When you upgrade XP SP2 to XP SP3 you lose the Address bar in the Taskbar's Toolbar. There is a way to 'fix' it but to me it isn't worth the bother. You can add Internet Explorer to the Toolbar easy and click it to bring up IE and enter the address. Click NEW Toolbar, locate the Internet Explorer in the Program Files and doubleclick it. It will be added to the Toolbar.

#### **HEADS UP!** CHECK YOUR RECEIPTS BEFORE LEAVING ANY CASHIER'S STATION!!!!!

It happened at Wal-Mart (Supercenter Store #1279

It happened at Wal-Mart a month ago.

I bought a bunch of stuff, over \$150, & I glanced at my receipt as the cashier was handing me the bags. I saw a cash-back of \$40. I told her I didn't request a cash back & to delete it.
