Emails from You to You that You didn't send OR

you are getting emails from friends and family asking you WHY did you send that email to me? You KNOW you did not send it.

This is sometimes due to someone who has your name in their address book having one of the worms that can hide itself and then use that email address book to send itself to everyone in the address book. It chooses a name in that address book to be listed as the SENDER so that it can remain hidden. That is why you received the email from yourself to yourself. Your name is in that address book.

This is what I've done and what I've advised many others with the problem to do that usually solves the problem. First of all, change your AOL password. Then send a generic message (blind copies) to everyone in your address book such as the one below.

"Dear Friends and Family.

Someone who has my name in their address book has a virus (worm) which is able to send itself to everyone in your address book. In order to stay hidden, it also uses one of the names in the address book as the Sender. This one has

chosen my email address. I have just received an email from myself to myself which I did not send....this is what the virus is able to do.

Please update your anti-virus program and run a full scan on all files.

Thanks,"

You probably won't hear from the person who has the virus...but they'll probably find it and get rid of it. And you won't get anymore of those emails...you may get some emails from a few saying, "I run my anti-virus program all the time. So, I know it's not me." Ignore those.

To uninstall Internet Explorer

If you're trying to uninstall Internet Explorer because of an issue with the browser, first check to see if a solution is listed in <u>Internet Explorer 9 Help and How-to</u>.

The following instructions apply to both Windows 7 and Windows Vista.

- 1. Click the Start button , type Programs and Features in the search box, and then click View installed updates in the left pane.
- 2. Under Uninstall an update, scroll down to the Microsoft Windows section.
- 3. Right-click Windows Internet Explorer 9, click Uninstall, and then, when prompted, click Yes.
- 4. Click one of the following:
 - Restart now (to finish the process of uninstalling Internet Explorer 9 and restore the previous version of Internet Explorer).
 - Restart later

Note

After you uninstall Internet Explorer 9, the previously installed version of Internet Explorer will be available on your PC. It isn't necessary to reinstall.

If the previous steps didn't work to uninstall Internet Explorer, see <u>How to uninstall or</u> remove Internet Explorer 9 when the standard uninstallation process doesn't work.

Wireless Roku XD Streams Netflix and Amazon Prime

Radio Shack has the Roku XD digital players (~ \$50 each). You connect the Roku to the TV using the video cables that come with the Roku.

After connecting you go to Roku.com, register the program, joined Netflix (\$9.99/mo), loaded the que with about a dozen movies. Use your TV remote to go to Channel 3. Then press the input on your TV remote to go to go to FRNT. Now, using the Roku remote click OK to turn on the Roku. This will bring up the list of movies and/or video channels. Use the arrows to go to the Netflix channel. When you click Netflix the first time, it will require you to log in your wireless network name and passcode. It will then the list the available Netflix movies ready for viewing. Click the movie you wish to watch and it will begin the streaming of that movie.

When the movie finishes, just use your TV remote to return to whatever channel you wish to watch. After a set period of time the Roku will shut itself off.

Great little box!!! The links above give all the info you need to connect and install and view movies very inexpensively.

There are many download sites listed on the Roku when you bring it up, but be careful to check if it's the type of movie downloads you want to watch. Also check if that download site is Free or for pay. For instance, Amazon has movies for download, but you must first register with Amazon and then pay for each movie you download. Or if you own a Kindle Fire you can pay an annual fee of \$79 for Amazon Prime.

AOL HELP Feature

If you are a paying member of AOL, you have option to call AOL support.

Most AOL or AOL.com problems can be solved by using AOL Help

- 1. Open the AOL program and click AOL HELP.
- 2. A page comes up with a Search blank. Enter the problem...such as problems with AOL Toolbar, Aol Runtime Errors, etc
- 3. Click Search or OK.

Below are some examples of answers to the problems listed above.

AOL Toolbar

Check the system requirements for AOL toolbar

Computers that fail to meet the minimum system requirements may experience this issue. Open AOL® System Information to check whether it meets the minimum system requirements mentioned below.

To open AOL System Information

Click **Start**, select **All Programs** or **Programs**, select **AOL** or **America Online**, and then click **AOL System Information**.

Note: Once you have verified the minimum system requirements, click **X** on the upper right to close the window.

Rebuild AOL toolbar

Run ToolbarFix.exe to rebuild the AOL toolbar. If the issue persists, delete the **toolbar.ind** and **toolbar.ist** files. Damaged **toolbar.ind** and **toolbar.ist** files may cause issues like garbled display and missing icons.

- 1. Run ToolbarFix.exe
- 2. Delete toolbar.ind and toolbar.lst

Run ToolbarFix.exe

To run ToolbarFix.exe

- 1. Go to AOL® Keyword: Toolbar Fix or http://greenhouse.aol.com/aol/ToolbarFix.exe.
- 2. Click **Save** or **Save File** to save the **ToolbarFix.exe** file.

Note: If prompted, navigate to the location where you want to save the **ToolbarFix.exe** file.

- 3. When the download is complete, sign off and close the AOL® software.

Delete toolbar.ind and toolbar.

To delete toolbar.ind and toolbar.lst on Windows XP

- 1. Please ensure that the AOL software is closed. Click **Start**, and then click **Search**.
- 2. Click the **All files and folders** link.
- 3. Click the **More advanced options** drop-down menu to open it, and select the boxes next to **Search system folders** and **Search hidden files and folders**.
- 4. In the **All or part of the file name** box, type **toolbar.***. Ensure that the **Look in** box is set to **Local Hard Drive (C:)**, and then click **Search**.
- 5. Once the search is completed, under **Name**, right-click the **toolbar.ind** file, and then click **Delete**.
- 6. Click **Yes** to confirm.
- 7. In the **Name** section, right-click the **toolbar.Ist** file, and then click **Delete**.
- 8. Click **Yes** to confirm.
- 9. Start the AOL software for a new, undamaged AOL toolbar.

Lower hardware acceleration and set color depth to 16 bit

To lower the hardware acceleration and set color depth to 16 bit on Windows XP/2000/Me/98 1. Open the **Control Panel** window.

- If you are using Windows XP, click Start, and then click Control Panel.
- If you are using Windows 2000/Me/98, click Start, select Settings, and then click Control Panel.

Note: If you are using **Category View** in Windows XP, click the **Appearance and Themes** icon.

- 2. Click the **Display** icon.
- 3. Click the **Settings** tab.
- 4. Click Advanced.
- 5. Click the appropriate tab.
 - If you are using Windows XP/2000, click the **Troubleshoot** or **Troubleshooting** tab.
 - If you are using Windows Me/98, click the **Performance** tab.

- 6. Lower **Hardware acceleration** by moving the slider one or more notches to the left, and then click **Apply**. Moving the slider all the way to the left will disable the hardware acceleration.
- 7. Click **OK**.
- 8. Click the Color drop-down menu, click High Color (16 bit), and then click Apply.
- 9. Click **OK**. The new desktop settings will be applied.
- 10. Click Yes.
- 11. Click OK.

Clear AOL Artwork Database

APC Backup Reset

When power fails and the APC sounds the alarm, it will need to be reset.

APC Back UP- flashing red light and cricket sound

- 1. Shut down computer
- 2. Press power button on UPS
- 3. Wait awhile
- 4. Press power button on UPS
- 5. Turn computer back on
- 6. Sound goes away
- 7. Bottom green light stays lit

Computer Reboot Cycling

Heat can cause a computer to reboot. A faulty fan or seized fan may not be cooling as it should. Also, dust bunnies can clog the fan. As soon as the CPU heats up, it will reboot. Try this.

- 1. Shutdown the computer and allow it to cool for about 10 minutes.
- 2. Remove the cover on the CPU cover.
- 3. Remove 'dust bunnies' using a can of compressed air blow out the dust.
- **4.** Power up the CPU. If it doesn't reboot now the problem may well be the computer fan or the fan on the processor unit, if there is one.
