These are phishing emails trying to take over your data and your machine. Someone is spoofing aol addresses so that you will click on them. DO NOT repeat, DO NOT click on that hyperlink should you receive such.Jmax

### **Snipping Tool in Win 7**

- 1. Click Start...All Programs...Accessories...Snipping Tool.**
- 2. In the small window that pops up on your screen, click NEW and then click the little down arrow and select how you want to select to Print Screen.**

**Once you clicked the New snip button, the Snipping tool's window will go away so you can be free to mark the screen with the rectangular cursor. There are four types of snips that you can choose from:**

- a. Free-form Snip. Draw an irregular line, such as a circle or a triangle, around an object.**

**b. Rectangular Snip.** Draw a precise line by dragging the cursor around an object to form a rectangle.

**c. Window Snip.** Select a window, such as a browser window or dialog box, that you want to capture.

**d. Full-screen Snip.** Capture the entire screen when you select this type of snip.

Try each one until you find the one you prefer.

### **Print Screen Key Doesn't Work**

Win 7 doesn't allow the Print Screen Key to work as it worked in previous Windows versions. Now when you press the Prt Scr key the image is sent to Win 7 memory.

Hold the ALT key and print Prt Scr key. Win 7 sends a picture of the current window, not the entire screen to the clipboard for pasting.

If you want a printout of the screen, press the prt scr key to send it to Win 7 memory. You won't see anything happen. Now, click START...All Programs...Accessories and doubleclick Paint to open the program. Click the Paste icon on the top menu. When the image appears, choose Print from the main menu to send it to the printer.

### **Laptop Settings Made Easy in Win 7**

1. Click START...control Panel...

2. Hold down the Windows Key (logo) and press the X key to bring up the Mobility Center.

3. Select the settings you prefer for:

**Volume, Battery, Wireless Network, Brightness, External Display, Sync Center, Screen Rotation, Presentation settings.**

Another way to reach the Mobility Center screen is:

Click START...Control Panel...Power Options and click Mobility Center near the right bottom of the screen.

### **Laptop Lid is Closed in Win 7**

**You may choose what happens when you close the lid to your laptop.**

**Click START...Control Panel**

**Select Power Options**

**On the left top column select 'What closing the lid does'.**

**Select your preferences when the laptop is running on battery and when it is running on plugin current.**

### **Traveling With Your Laptop**

**Caution! Before traveling with your laptop, backup the important data. Thieves steal laptops much more often than they steal desktops, cars, etc. All versions of windows comes with a backup/restore program. However, I've not found these to work well for me. Instead, I suggest using an external hard drive which you leave at home when you travel with your laptop. Use appropriate size flash drives while traveling to backup any recent data.**
