## Great sites to check for your family information

www.mytrees.com or www.kindredkonnections.com

Most of what you will find on these web sites is supplied by users to mytrees.com, as stated on the web site "The concept of DATABASES FREELY GIVEN will be FREELY SHARED". There is a fee to access detailed data, but that fee maybe generated with sweat equity by submitting you own GEDCOM. If you pay the fee, the subscription prices are:

\$7 for ten days,\$15 for one month,\$35 for one quarter or \$100 for one year.

Cyndi's List at <u>www.cyndislist.com</u> This is the largest most comprehensive list of links to genealogical related links in the world. The best part of this web site is FREE.

International Genealogical Index (IGI) at <u>www.familysearch.org</u>. This site was created by Church of Jesus Christ of Later-day Saints or LDS. This site is also FREE. If you need to see a microfilm or microfiche they may be ordered at the LDS church in Leesburg and viewed there.

Rootsweb at <u>www.rootsweb.com</u>. This is another large collection of free indexes. The information here has NOT been verified, however you can use it as a starting point for you own research and verification.

Ancestry.com at <u>www.ancestry.com</u>. This is a paid site. They are currently selling monthly memberships at 29.95 US only or 39.95 for the world. If you choose an annual world the fee is 347.40 a year. These prices have gone up, but is you use Family Tree Maker 2006 you almost need to pay these prices to get copies of the indexed data.

Heritage Quest at <u>www.heritagequestonline.com</u>. This site may only be accessed at your library. If you had a membership in a society that had access, that access is going away as soon as the subscription expires. From what I can tell as of this writing only Marion County Library and Sumter County has remote access. The Lake County Library has access, but you need to be there in person to view the data.

These charges may be paid with a credit card. Caution though. When charging in a non dollar denominated currency, the credit card company may charge you a fee in addition.

For New England genealogy the New England Historic Genealogical Society at <u>www.newenglandancestors.org</u> may be the place to check out. To research all of their data bases has a cost of \$75.00 per year. However, some of their information is free such as the SSDI.

For many of us the newsletter that is produced by Richard Eastman is a way to keep up with what is happening in the field of genealogy. The plus addition is fee based and has some extra articles that may be of interest. I subscribe to the Plus Edition and pay through Pay-Pal at 19.95 per year..
