

## Cassettes to CDs Readme

Hi Maxine,

After a little thought I figured I'd just send you the instructions.

Assuming you have a tape deck with RCA outputs, you need to get a miniplug-to-RCA adapter cable. Connect your tape deck output to the computer input.

Once you've done that, follow my instructions in the attached documents and it should go without a hitch. The screens shown in the WORD documents are from Easy CD Creator version 5. If you have the FULL version of Creator 4, it also has Spin Doctor (which you will need). My own experience was that version 4 which came with my computer did not have Spin Doctor.

Hard to say if the boombox would be satisfactory or not. This would be my suggestion. I'm assuming the boombox has a Left and Right channel output (tape output...not earphone or headphone output....tape out is at a much lower millivoltage than earphone or headphone output). I would connect the boombox to the stereo (usually stereos have an AUX input which would work fine for the boombox). Then play a tape with the boombox, but through the stereo. Put the same tape in your good tape deck and play it and decide if you hear any difference in quality. If no difference, then your boombox is a good candidate. However...if you have a tape deck in your stereo system which can be relocated to the den, you might want to do that anyway, and just transfer ALL your tapes to CD. Then you won't be needing the tape deck at your stereo . Just a thought.
