Cassettes to Cds using PlusDeck

I read your e-mail newsletter of July 17 and noticed this topic and wanted to share what I use.

I use a plusdeck 2c and it mounts into one of the cd bays in my tower. The plusdeck comes with its own software and can be set to convert to .wav or .mp3 files. The best part of it is you do not have to be at the computer when the cassette stops playing. The file stops converting and is ready for you whenever you are.

My experience in the past hooking up external tape decks or whatever to the computer was always that I had to be right there when the cassette stopped and click on the software conversion to stop as well, otherwise the file would continue to grow and grow with blank space.

The Korean company that makes this deck also now makes an external plusdeck that can be plugged into a usb port and does a great deal more. Computergeeks and Amazon sell these products in the U.S. and perhaps some others as well. You can see the operator's manuals at their website www.plusdeck.com.
