Vista Windows Photo Gallery

Windows Photo Gallery is where you can view, manage, and refine your photos and home movies.

A toolbar across the top of offers shortcuts to tasks and information, while the left-hand navigation bar provides access to organizational elements. You can use the control bar at the bottom of the screen to launch a slide show with a single click, and use the slider to quickly resize your thumbnails for comfortable viewing.

Photo Gallery offers basic photo editing, such as the ability to easily remove red eye. If you decide you don't want to keep the changes, you can revert to the original version of the photo with one click.

Vista Photo Gallery works similarly to other photo editing programs such as Picasa 3, Gimp, ImageForge, Paint.net, Photofiltre, Picnik, PhotoPlus, etc.

Photos usually are stored in the Pictures folder. Vista's Photo Gallery merely creates a list of those photos but does not store them in the Photo Gallery. Photo Gallery is the editing program. You may chose a photo from the list it creates and that photo will come up and you can edit it as you please and save the edited picture. The edited photo will be stored then back in the folder where the original picture was stored. The original will not be changed.
