RESOURCE METER (WIN98)

Applications can tax today's hardware, not to mention something you bought in the past. Keep a close eye on your resources with Windows 98's Resource Meter. When loaded, this utility appears in the taskbar and gives you one-click access to the overall general health of your system. Follow these steps to locate and load this valuable tool:

- 1. Click the Start button and select Programs.
- 2. Choose Accessories, System Tools, Disk Resource Meter.
- 3. Click OK to bypass the dialog box.
- 4. Double-click the Resource Meter icon in the taskbar to view your resources.
 - 5. Click OK to return Resource Meter to its minimized state.

Resources is a factor of RAM and the number of programs running that require these resources. When the resources drop below about 60% it's time to reboot in order to regain the resources used. You might also consider removing programs from Startup except Anti-virus, Firewall, etc. Other programs can have their icons placed on the taskbar for easy start should you need to open them.

RESOURCE CHECK IN XP (PERFORMANCE)

- 1. Rightclick the taskbar and select Task Manager to bring up the Windows Task Manager.
- 2. Click on the Performance tab to see the CPU usage and Page File usage graphs.

If CPU usage is above 50%, then the AOL user may be more prone to resource issues that affect AOL connectivity.
