Converting audio to MP3 files the fun way by Kim Komando

J.B. in Kalispel, MT, has audio recordings of veterans. He wants to edit the audio and post it as MP3 files on the Internet. It sounds like a great project, J.B. So let me help you get started.

First, you need to get the audio onto the computer. If it is on CD, use a program like RealPlayer to import the audio as a wave file. Open RealPlayer and click Tools>>Preferences. Click CD and select Wave (.wav) in the top box. Click OK.

If the audio isn't on CD, read my tip on <u>recording audio with Audacity</u>.

Also, use Audacity to edit the files. Once you're done editing, save them as MP3 files. You'll need the LAME encoder. Click File>>Export as MP3. Name the file and click Save. Use the following links to download <u>Audacity</u> and the <u>LAME encoder</u>. They're both free.

To burn a CD, insert a blank disc in the drive. Click View>>CD/DVD and then click Save Tracks and OK.
