Computer Graphics on cloth by Nancy Henderson

1. Scan picture into computer. Send to Adobe Photo or other similar program and edit to your satisfaction.

2. Iron freezer paper (shiny side) to wrong side of fabric and cut into $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ sheets. Feed these individually through the printer. I made 4 copies of the picture per sheet.

3. After printing the picture, I added the text, took out the background picture, and ran the sheets back through the printer. There is probably a way to do all of this at one time and avoid the extra time it took to print twice.

4. After the ink has dried thoroughly, I placed a press cloth over the picture and heat set them for about 10 seconds (don't move the iron--just press!) Peel off the press cloth but leave the freezer paper intact.

5. I used my serger to cut and bind the edges of each picture, making it into a patch for the ladies to sew onto a vest or bag. When you are finished with the binding, peel off the freezer paper backing.
