

FLAW IN WINDOWS MEDIA PLAYER

An anti-piracy feature in the Microsoft program could allow an intruder to seize control of a user's machine. Windows Media Player erroneously discloses the location of the user's temporary file cache in Internet Explorer. That information could be used to bypass security in Internet Explorer.
